Today the world is watching Aleppo targeted. It has become a symbol of devastation, a city of ruins holding onto its last breath of dwindling resources.

Yet there is rebirth, as hundreds of babies are being born into this war zone. Hospitals are losing doctors and staff due to military aggression, while trying to provide continual quality healthcare.

In these conditions with incredibly limited resources, mothers and newborns can't receive the healthcare they need; yet life is still happening in Aleppo.
